Watch Out For The Evil Heart!

Do you ever just open you Bible and read the first thing that pops up and seek a lesson in it? I expect we all do. Perhaps, we might even think what we find is God directed. Today I opened my Bible with such an idea, just to see what I saw. The first thing that popped up (the Red Lettered caught my eye) was Jesus saying, "Why do you entertain evil thoughts in your hearts?" (Matt. 9:4, NIV). Good question, I thought.

Why? Do I? Hope not. Try not.

Well looking closer, I see that Jesus is talking to the teachers of the law, who were saying amongst themselves of him, "This fellow is blaspheming!" Jesus had just told a paralytic, "Take heart, son, your sins are forgiven."

Questions for thought: Does what the teachers of the law said sound like an "evil in your hearts!" statement? Do you think they thought that way, that what they were saying was because they had evil in their hearts? Or do you think they thought they were thinking and acting correctly, perhaps protecting what they thought they were to protect? Frankly, I am not sure we can answer those questions. We might not see the statement like Jesus did, but Jesus knew the "innards" of their hearts. He could truthfully call it "evil." And, if Jesus recognized it as evil, it was evil.

Application: Does what comes out of our hearts sometimes come from evil thoughts without our even knowing it? Do we think we are doing and saying it right when, in fact, we are not? Maybe it is from a jealousy. Maybe it from a misconception of what we think is going on. Maybe, just maybe, we don't understand what the plan of God is. The lesson is, I think, that we had better watch out on the reasons for what we say and do. It very well might be that what we do and say comes from evil and not good. One thing for sure, Jesus knows.

Conclusion: We should be more careful. We should watch out that we do not act from evil in our hearts.

Children’s Bible Time Request

Parents of children who attend CBT, please remember the following guidelines set by the elders:

AGE POLICY — To make our program more efficient and effective, please be sure to help enforce the age limits for CBT. CBT is specifically designed for 3-8 year olds. If you have a child younger than three or older than 8, please keep them with you.

DISCIPLINE POLICY — 1. Use positive reinforcement (“I like the way Sally is sitting quietly”) as much as possible. 2. Verbal Warning. 3. Return child to parent/caregiver in the auditorium.

We have had several incidences where teachers had to send children back to the auditorium who were too old or were repeatedly disobeying or being disrespectful.
